Swoop airline adds daily flights between St. John's, Hamilton

As part of its 2020 summer schedule, Swoop, a low-fare subsidiary of WestJet, announced an expansion into eastern Canada with flights between Hamilton and St. John's. Swoop will have daily flights to St. John's International, as well as flights to Moncton four days a week, and Charlottetown three days a week. The new service between John C. Munro Hamilton International Airport and St. John's will run from June through October 2020 as a test period to see how that goes, and then the company will start looking at their winter schedule. www.flyswoop.com

Kraken Robotics to map 5,000 square kilometres of Atlantic ocean floor

Ocean technology company Kraken Robotics will retrofit a former RCMP patrol vessel to carry sophisticated sonars and lasers capable of capturing detailed images of the ocean floor. The \$2 million retrofit of the Ocean Seeker represents a milestone as the first project in action for the Ocean Supercluster establishing Atlantic Canada as a global hub for ocean innovation. krakenrobotics.com

City Building Permits (year to date)

As of December 31, 2019 the value of:

- Commercial permits were down-23% from \$265,199,327 in 2018 to \$203,904,775 in 2019
- Industrial permits were valued at \$5,000 for 2018 and \$1,812,266 for 2019
- Government/Institutional permits were down from \$12,713,670 in 2018 to \$4,726,650 in 2019*
- Residential permits were down -30% to \$50,660,436 for 2019 over \$72,872,094 for 2018
- Repair permits were down -20%, from \$2,602,660 in 2018 to \$2,375,934 in 2019
- Total value of all permits was down -25% to \$263,480,060 for 2019 over \$353,392,751 for 2018
- * Note that this data does not include the full range of permit activity undertaken by the provincial government and Memorial University.
