Instruction Guide:

Completing the vote-by-mail kit

This simple 'how to' guide will assist you in completing your vote-by-mail kit for the City of St. John's 2025 Municipal General Election.



2025 Municipal General Election

The 2025 Municipal General Election will be held on Thursday, October 2nd, 2025.

The City of St. John's conducts its municipal elections using a vote-by-mail system and uses the permanent voters list established and maintained by Elections NL.

All residents that are on the voters list will be mailed a vote-by-mail kit through Canada Post. Ensuring that you are on the voters list and that your information is correct is very important.

To check if you are on the voters list please visit the <u>Voter portal</u>. An <u>instructional guide</u> is available to help you through the process.



What is in the vote-by-mail kit?

The vote-by-mail kit includes:

- Double-sided Voter instructions explain how to complete the vote-by-mail kit and return it to the City; provide the location of the Satellite Drop-off Centre in your Ward; and include a detachable Declaration Form.
- Your official ballot which is ward specific.
- 2 envelopes the white secrecy envelope in which you will
 place your completed ballot and a yellow return envelope
 which is used to return your completed kit back to the City.

Sign & Return your Declaration Form

Please be sure to detach and sign the declaration form and include it in the return envelope.

If your declaration form is not signed or if it is not included in the return envelope, your kit will not be accepted and your ballot will not be counted.

Vote-By-Mail Kit – Page 1

This is a sample of the first page of the instructions in your kit.

Your kit will come addressed to you (see first red arrow).

Read the voting instructions to ensure you:

- correctly complete the ballot
- return all necessary items
- use the appropriate envelopes

The second red arrow indicates the signature line where you **MUST** sign the form. Your name and address appear below the line.

VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

These steps keep your vote secret, and ensure your ballot is not spoiled. By law, a spoiled ballot cannot be counted. To make sure your vote is counted, you must:

- Complete the Ballot and insert into the white Ballot Secrecy Envelope. (SEAL ENVELOPE)
- Insert the white Ballot Secrecy Envelope into the yellow Election Return Envelope. (DO NOT SEAL ENVELOPE YET)
- Sign and detach the Declaration Form found on the bottom of this page and insert into the yellow Election Return Envelope. (SEAL ENVELOPE)
- Mail yellow Election Return Envelope by Thursday, Deadline Date Hore

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON REVERSE

I, the undersigned, declare that I am a Canadian Citizen, 18 years of age or older, eligible to vote in this election and that I have not already voted for any office on this ballot.




Vote-By-Mail Kit – Page 2

The second (double-sided) page of the instructions will provide you with information related to the kit, voting and the ways you can return your completed kit.

It also provides you with the location of the Election Day Satellite Drop-off Centre in your Ward. These locations have drop-bins where you can deposit your completed kit, and you can also register on site if you have not voted or received a kit. You must go to the Satellite Drop-off Centre in your ward to register on October 2, 2025.

Detach the bottom portion of this page (see red arrow), sign the form and include it in your yellow return envelope.




Official Ballot Sample

This is a mock ballot for training purposes ——

The official ballot you will receive is specific to the Ward in which you reside.

This sample ballot is for residents of Ward 1.

The Ward is noted in the top right of the ballot and the candidates running in Ward 1 are listed.




Completing the Ballot

When completing your ballot, fill in the oval next to your selected candidates completely with **black or blue ink**. **Do not use a pencil**.

Do not mark your choice with an 'X' or a check mark '

Do not write anything else on the ballot.

The image to the right shows a correctly completed ballot, with the ovals filled in entirely with black ink.




Incorrect Ballot

Envelopes

There are two (2) envelopes included in the vote-by-mail kit. Your completed ballot goes into the Ballot Secrecy Envelope (the white envelope). The sealed ballot secrecy envelope (with your ballot inside) and your signed declaration form are placed into the yellow return envelope.



How do I put it all together?

- 1. Complete your ballot as instructed, use a black or blue ink, do not use pencil.
- 2. Place your **completed ballot** in the **white secrecy envelope** and **seal** the envelope. **Do not** put your declaration form in the **secrecy envelope**!
- 3. Put the white secrecy envelope in the yellow envelope, but do not seal the yellow envelope yet!
- **4. Sign** your declaration form and detach it.
- 5. Add the signed, detached declaration form to the yellow envelope. Ensure that the City's return address is facing out of the window of the envelope.
- 6. Do a double check:
 - ensure that the ballot is in the secrecy envelope and it is sealed
 - confirm that your declaration form is signed and that the City's address is facing out the window of the envelope.
- 7. If all is in order, seal the yellow envelope!

How do I return my completed kit?

There are several options for residents to return their completed vote-by-mail kit for the election.

 The most convenient way is to mail your completed kit back to the City through Canada Post.

To ensure that it is received in time for counting, it should be in the mail on or before Wednesday, September 24th.

- 2. Drop your completed kit in one of the drop-boxes located in City facilities or the drop-box outside of City Hall.
 - The drop-boxes in City facilities will be available from September 15th to October 2nd (8:00 pm). **Please note** that the drop box at the Southlands Community centre is <u>not</u> available on election day.
 - The drop-box outside of City Hall is available until 8:00 pm on election day.
- 3. Bring your completed kit to the Satellite Drop-off Centre in your Ward on election day.

Ward 5 – Southlands Community Centre – 40 Teakwood Drive (drop off available until October 1 at this location only)

Accessibility

Accessibility is very important to the City of St. John's.

We've worked with the community to include features to assist voters at home or in-person at the Satellite Drop-off Centres.

Residents living with vision loss may use their own technology to vote and, if voting in-person, a braille kit will be available.

Where are the Satellite Drop-off Centres on election day?

On **election day**, a Satellite Drop-off Centre will be **open in each Ward**, from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. Ward residents that did not receive a kit and wish to vote or have not already returned their kit to the City, can visit the Satellite Drop-off Centre on election day.

Election Staff will be on hand to register residents who did not receive a kit and to collect completed vote-by-mail kits.

You must visit the centre **in your ward** to register and receive your ballot on election day.
