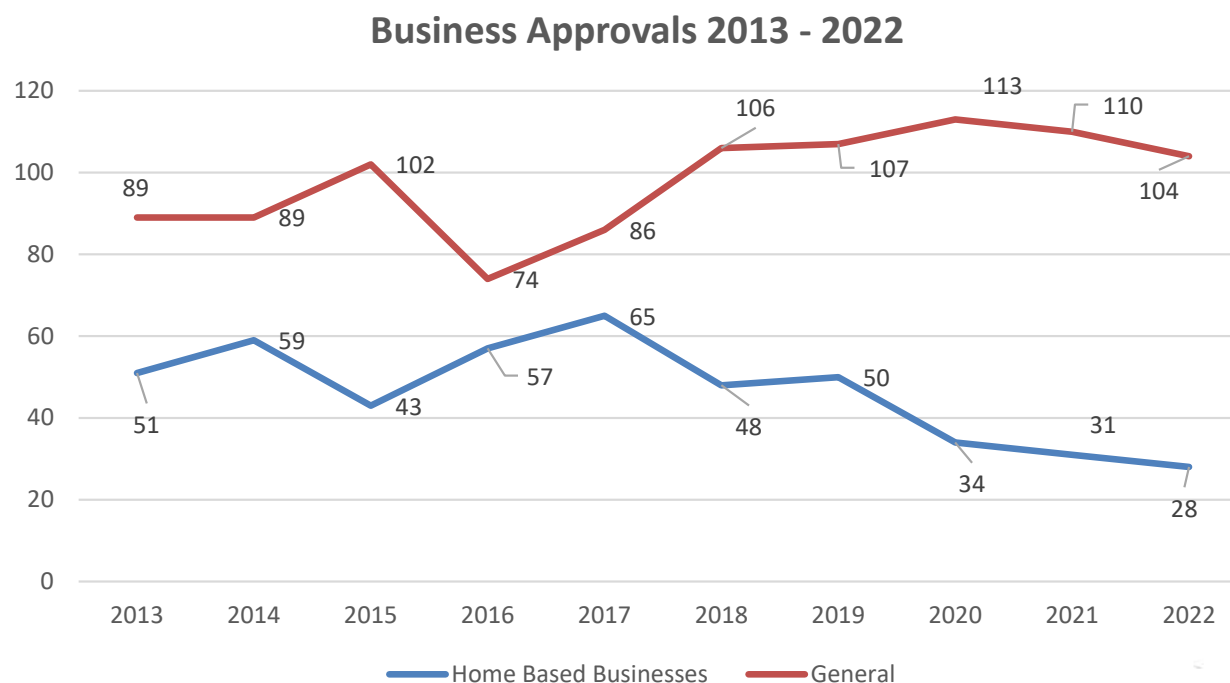
The number of persons employed is expected to increase in 2022 and the unemployment rate is forecast to decrease 0.8 percentage points to 7.0%.

Business Approvals

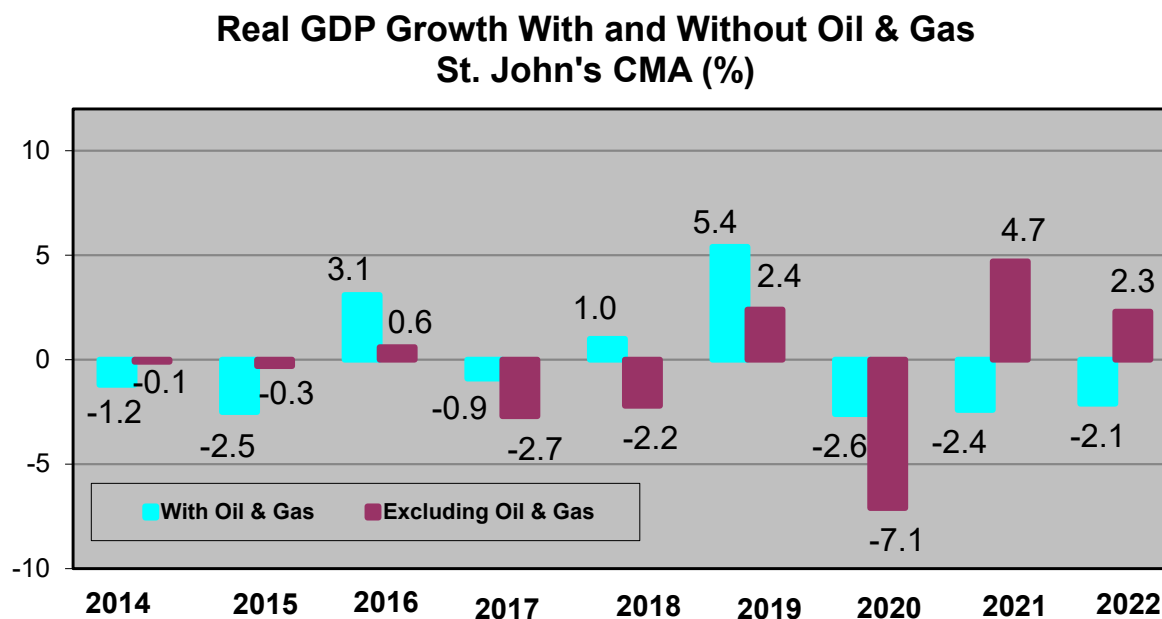
There were 132 businesses approved by St. John's City Council in 2022; 21.2% of those were for small home-based businesses.

Economic Growth and Oil Production

Overall real GDP growth in the St. John's CMA decreased slightly primarily due to lower offshore oil production. The provincial oil industry is allocated to the CMA, meaning the CMA's real GDP is influenced by fluctuations in oil production levels.

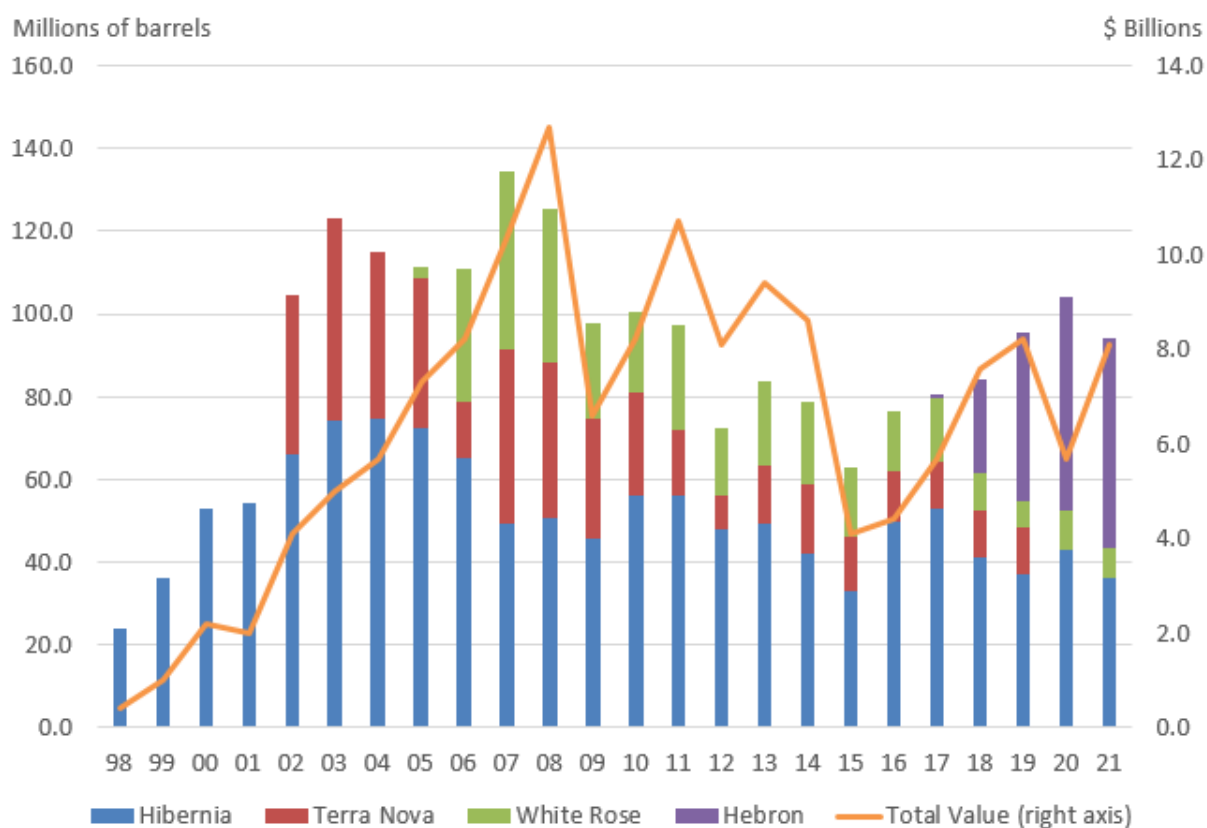

Despite lower production, the value of oil production rose by 43.2% to \$8.1 billion due to higher crude oil prices. Oil production 2021 = 94.0 MMbbls.

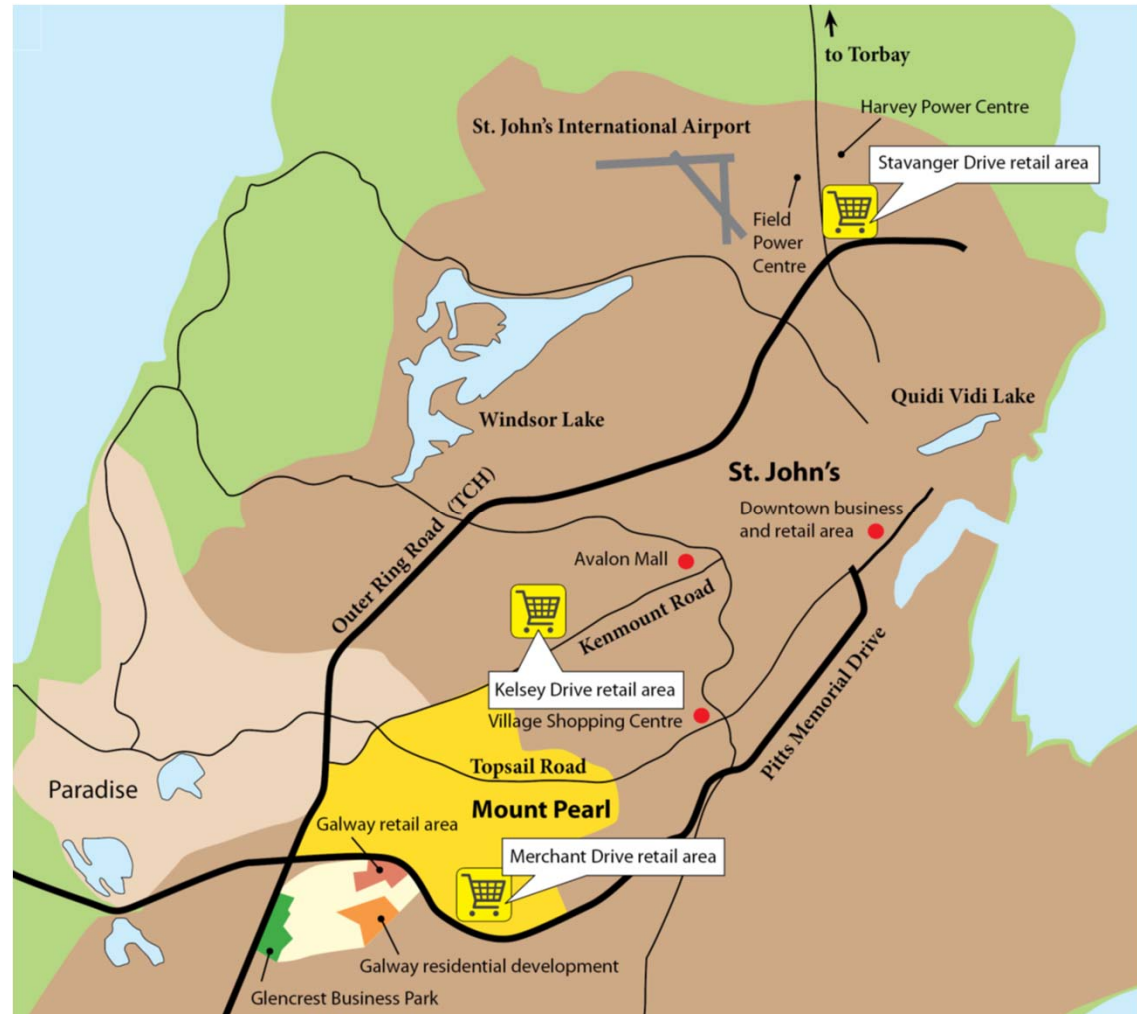

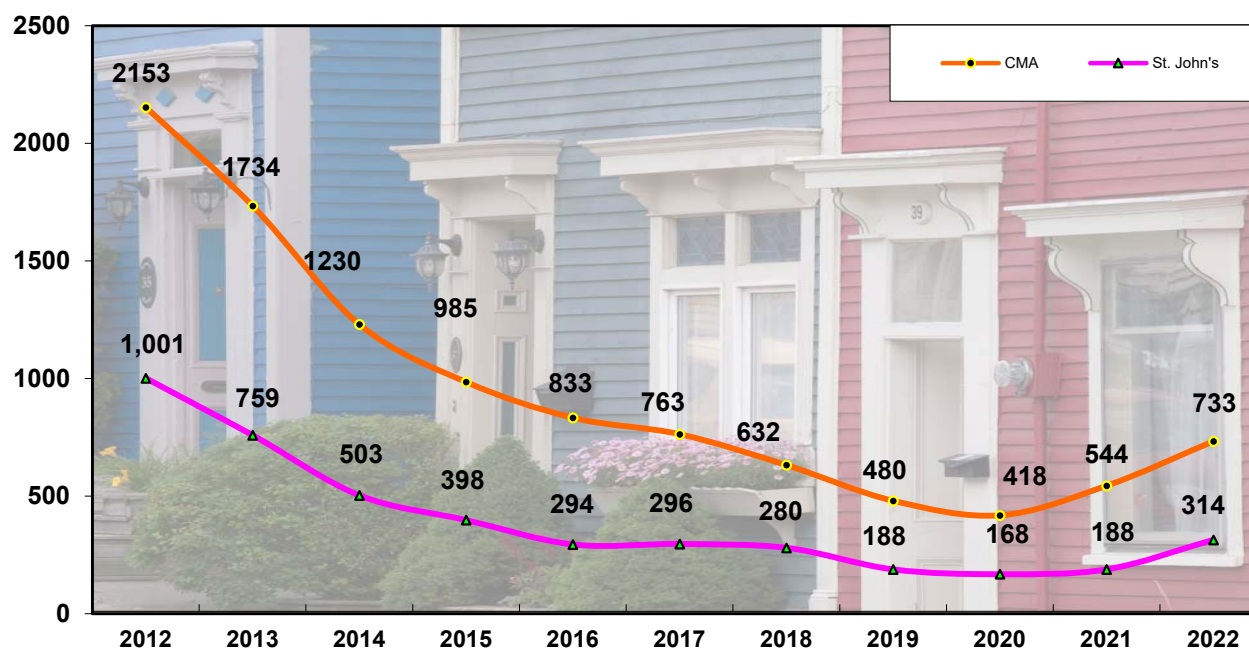

2012 - 2022

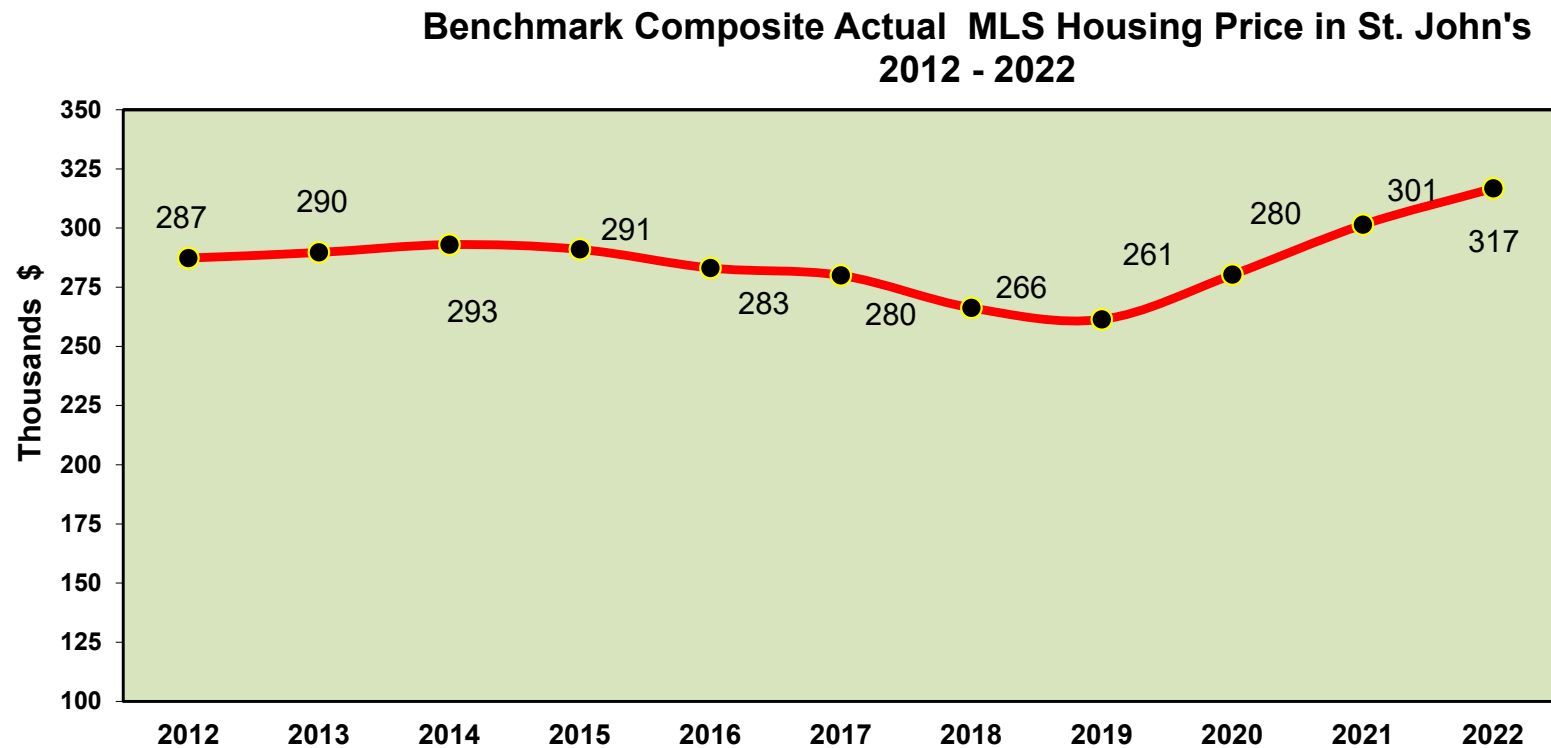

Benchmark MLS[®] housing price increased 5.3% in 2022.



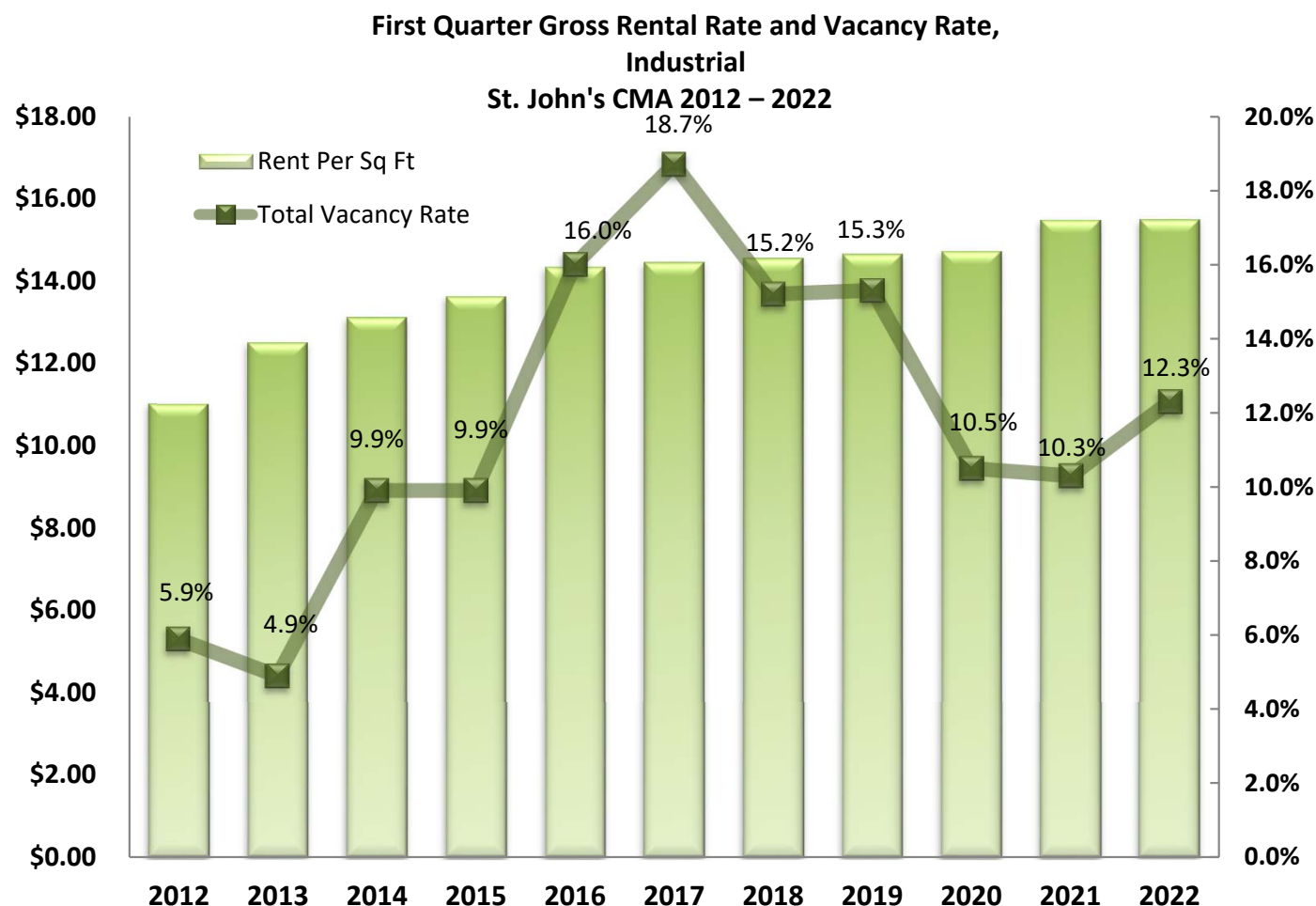

Industrial Market Rental Rates

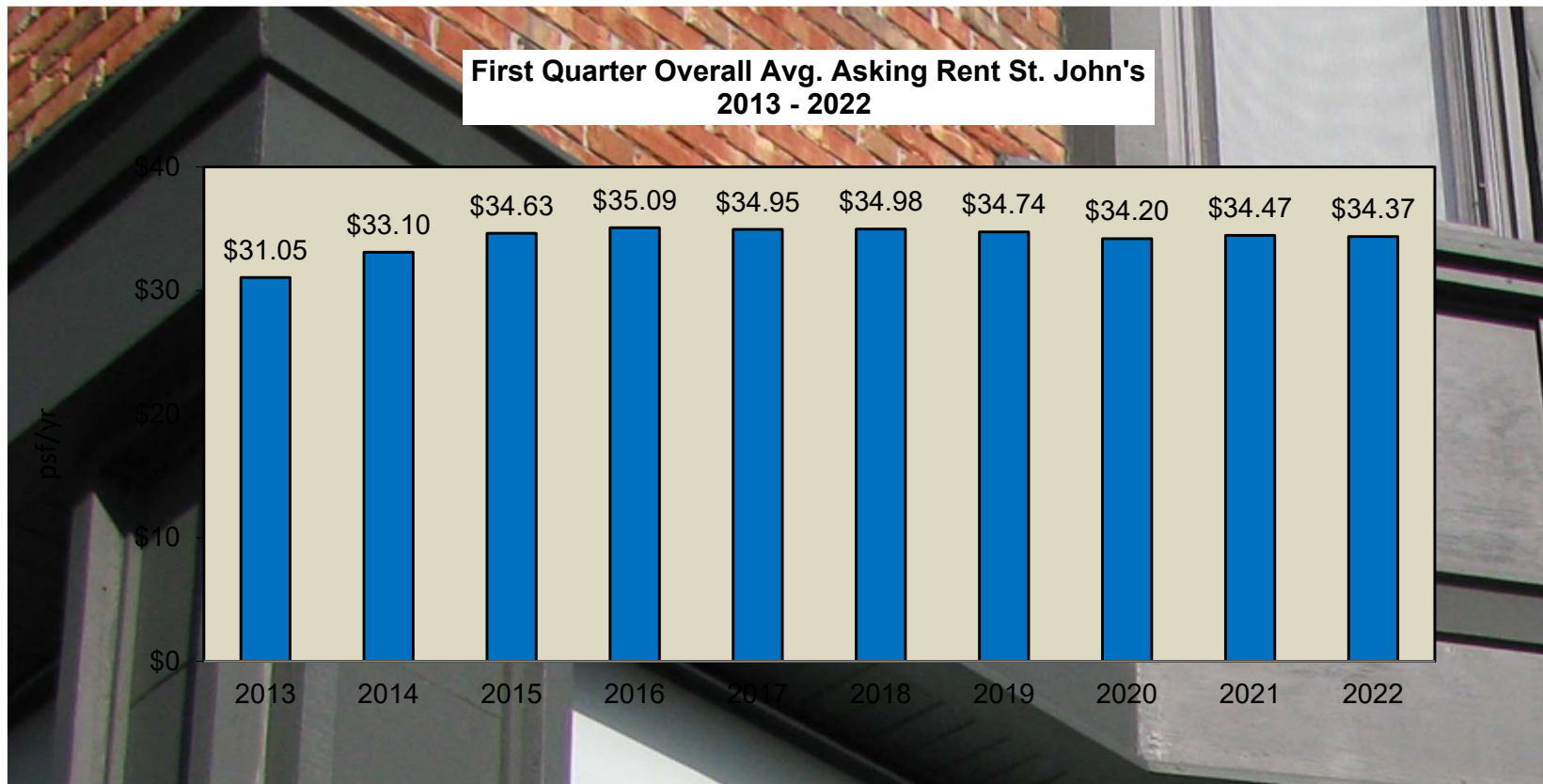

Office market rental rates remained on par in the first quarter of 2022 at \$34.47 per sq. ft.

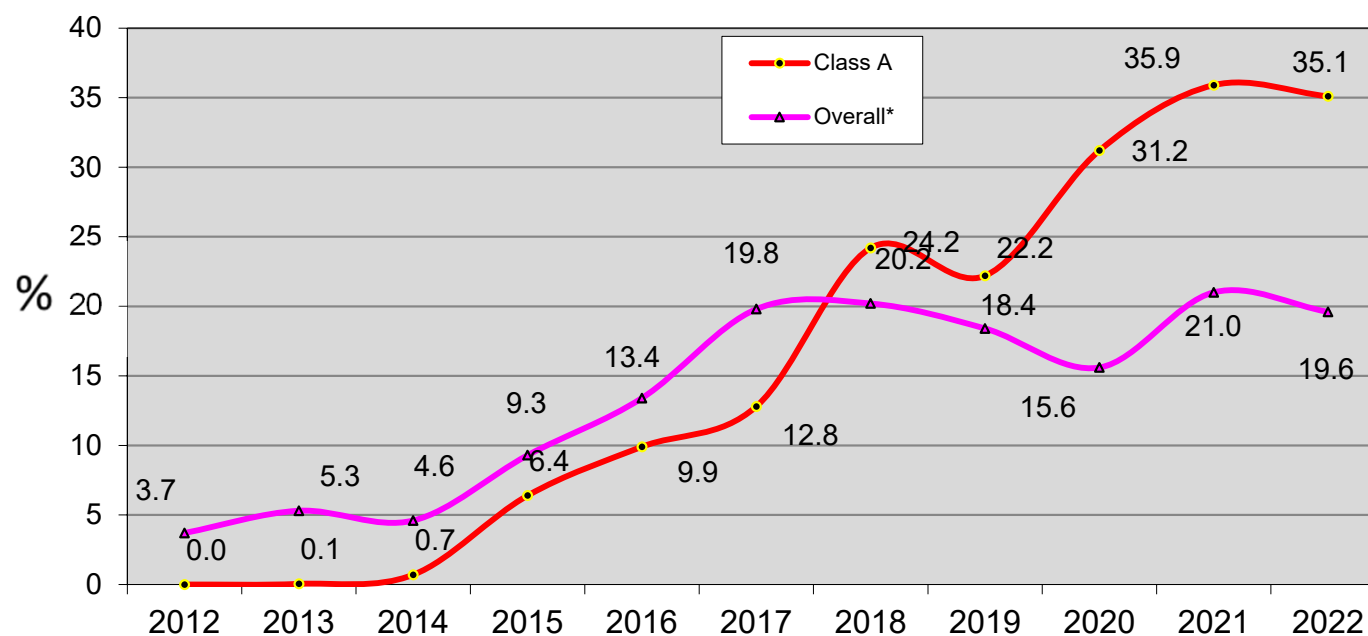

2012 - 2022**



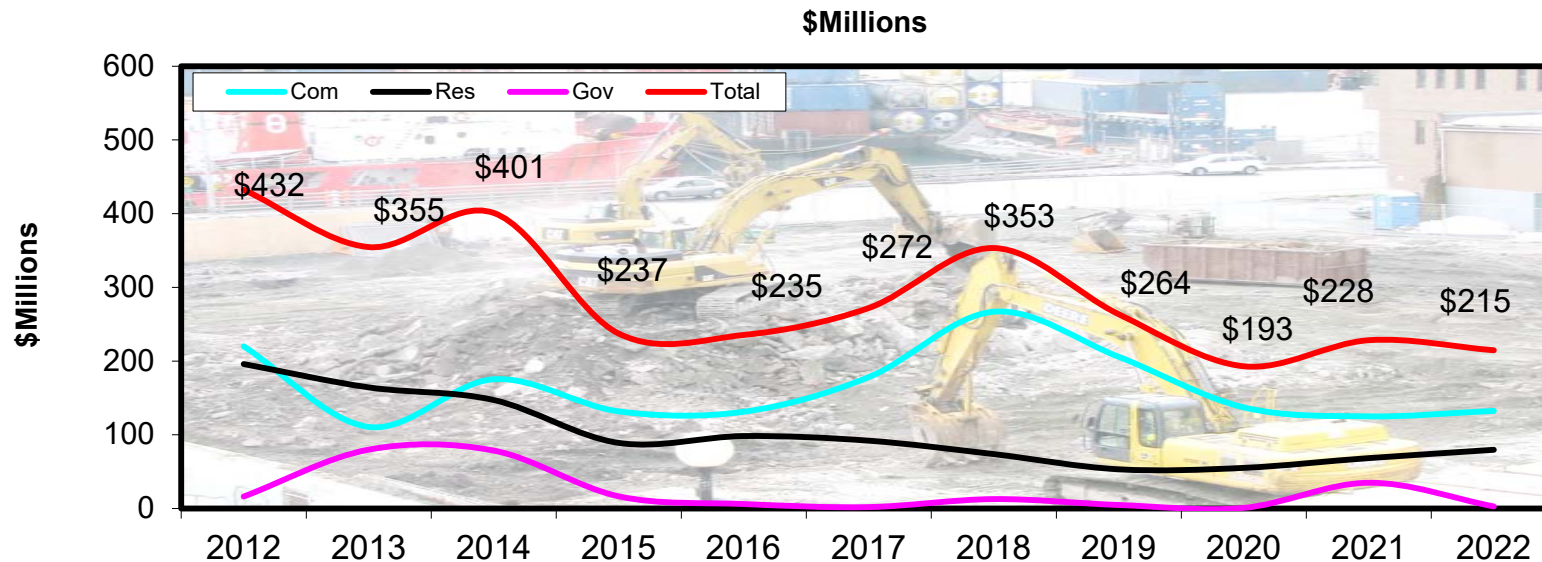

Building Permits

The total value of building permits in the City of St. John's decreased -6% to \$214.6 million in 2022. The value of commercial permits increased by 9.0% to \$132.3 million in 2022.

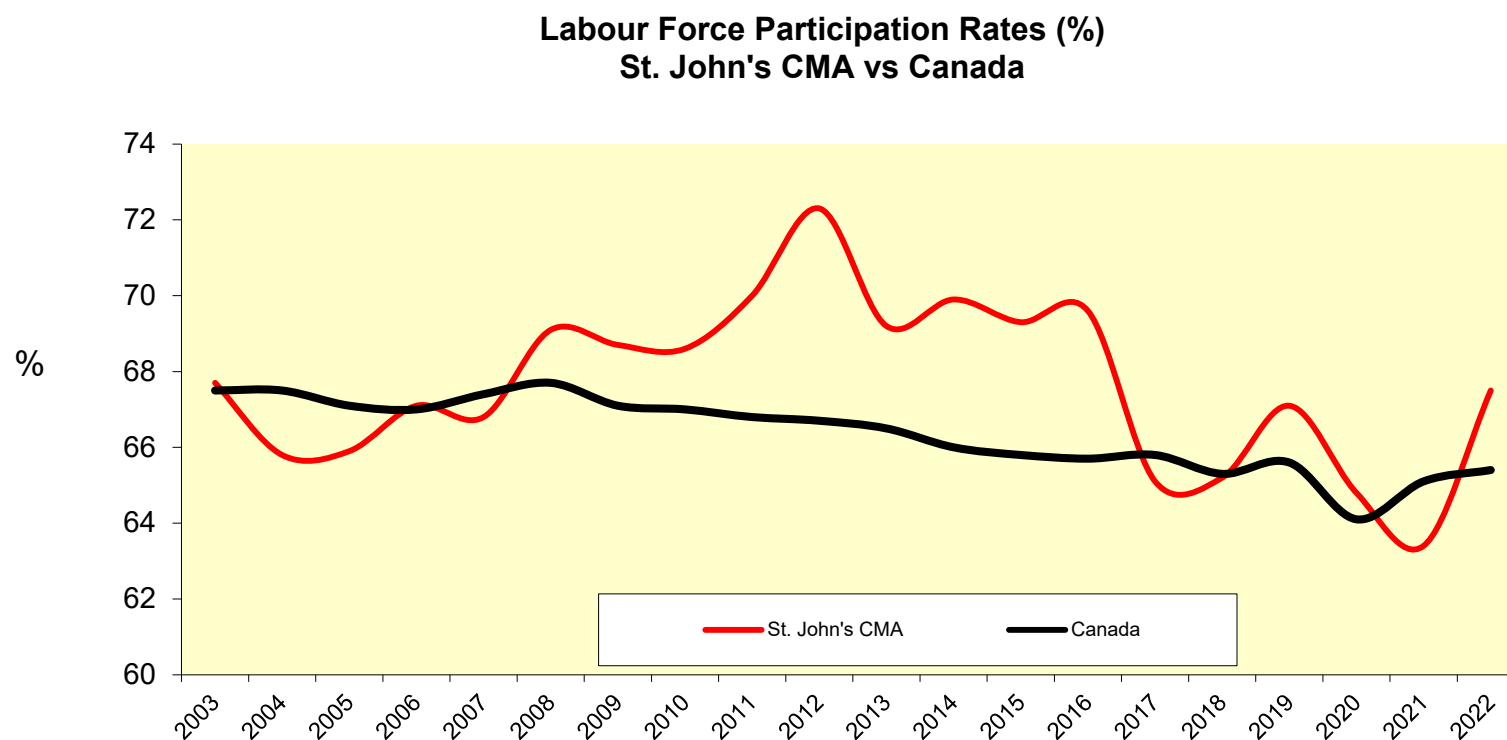
Investment in residential and non-residential building construction in the St. John's CMA was \$21.6 million in 2021, up 145% from March 2020.

Annual Unemployment Rate

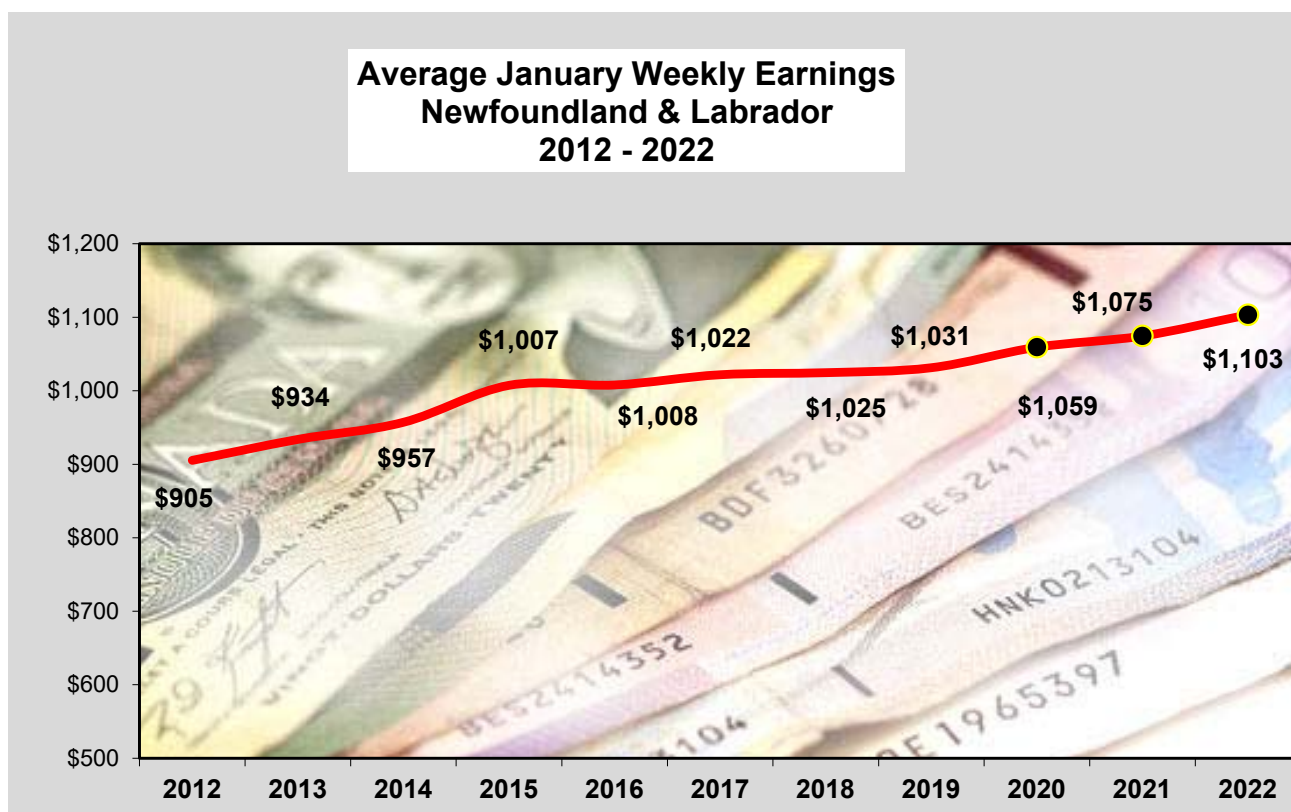
The annual unemployment rate for the St. John's CMA was 6.7% in 2022. The rate for Canada was **5.3%**.

Average weekly earnings increased 2.7% in January 2022 to \$1,075 in Newfoundland and Labrador. The consumer price index, an indicator of changes in consumer prices, increased 5.5% in January 2022 compared to January 2021 in the province.

Low-income status is determined based on low-income measure, after-tax (LIM-AT). For a one-person household, the after-tax low-income measure (LIM-AT) was \$25,505 in 2020. For larger households, this amount was adjusted upward by multiplying it by the square root of household size. Persons in a private household with after-tax income below this threshold were considered to be in low income.

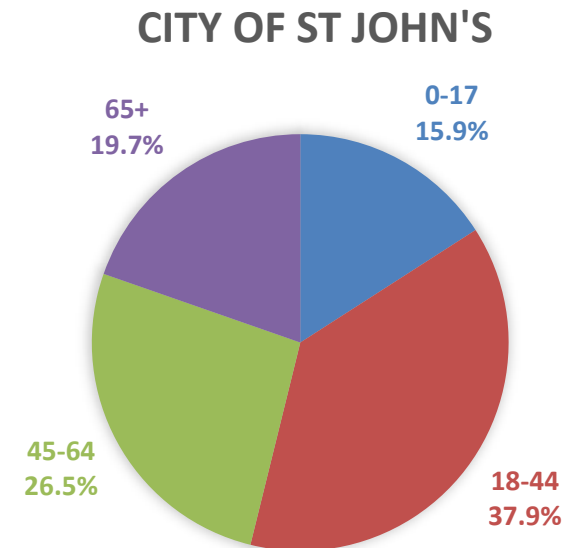
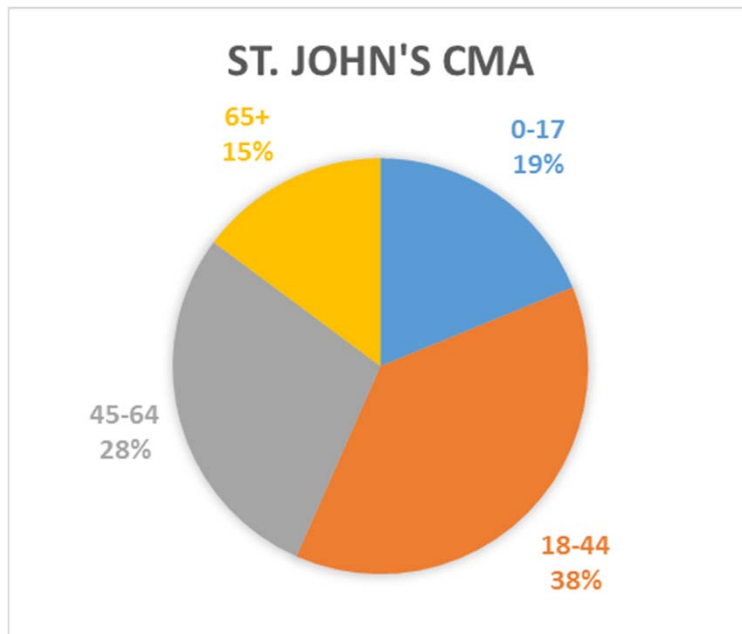

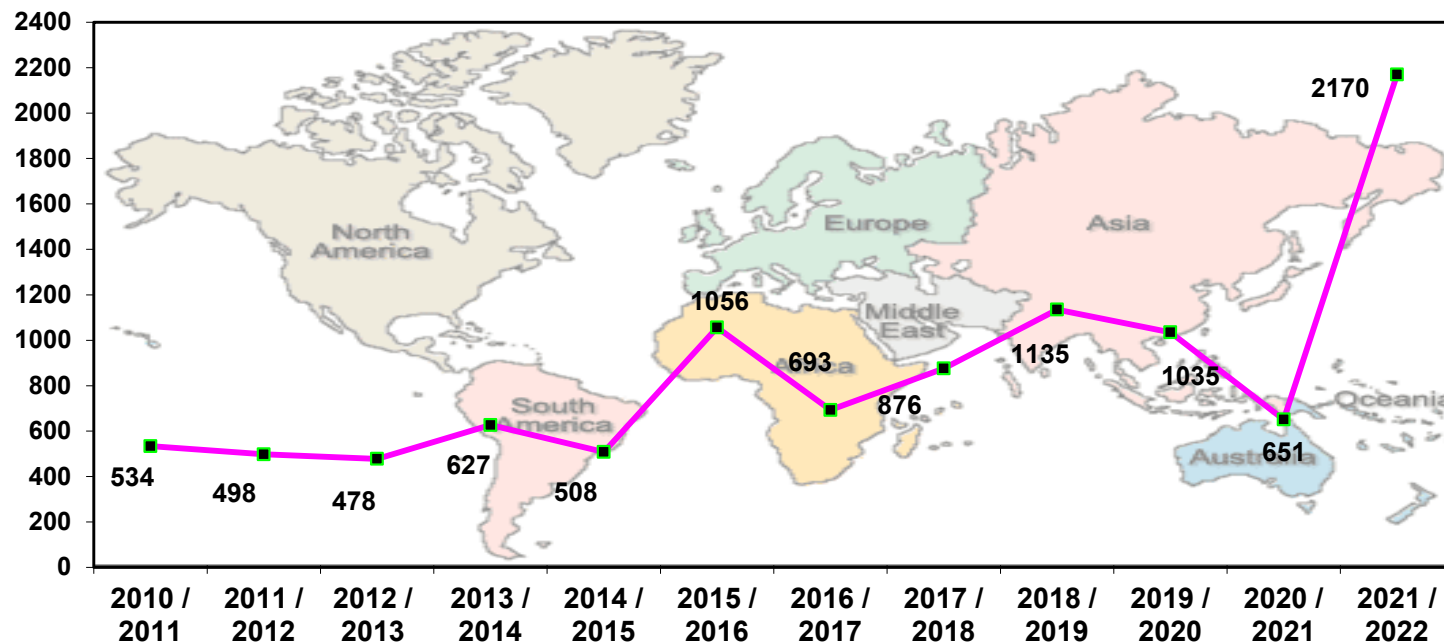

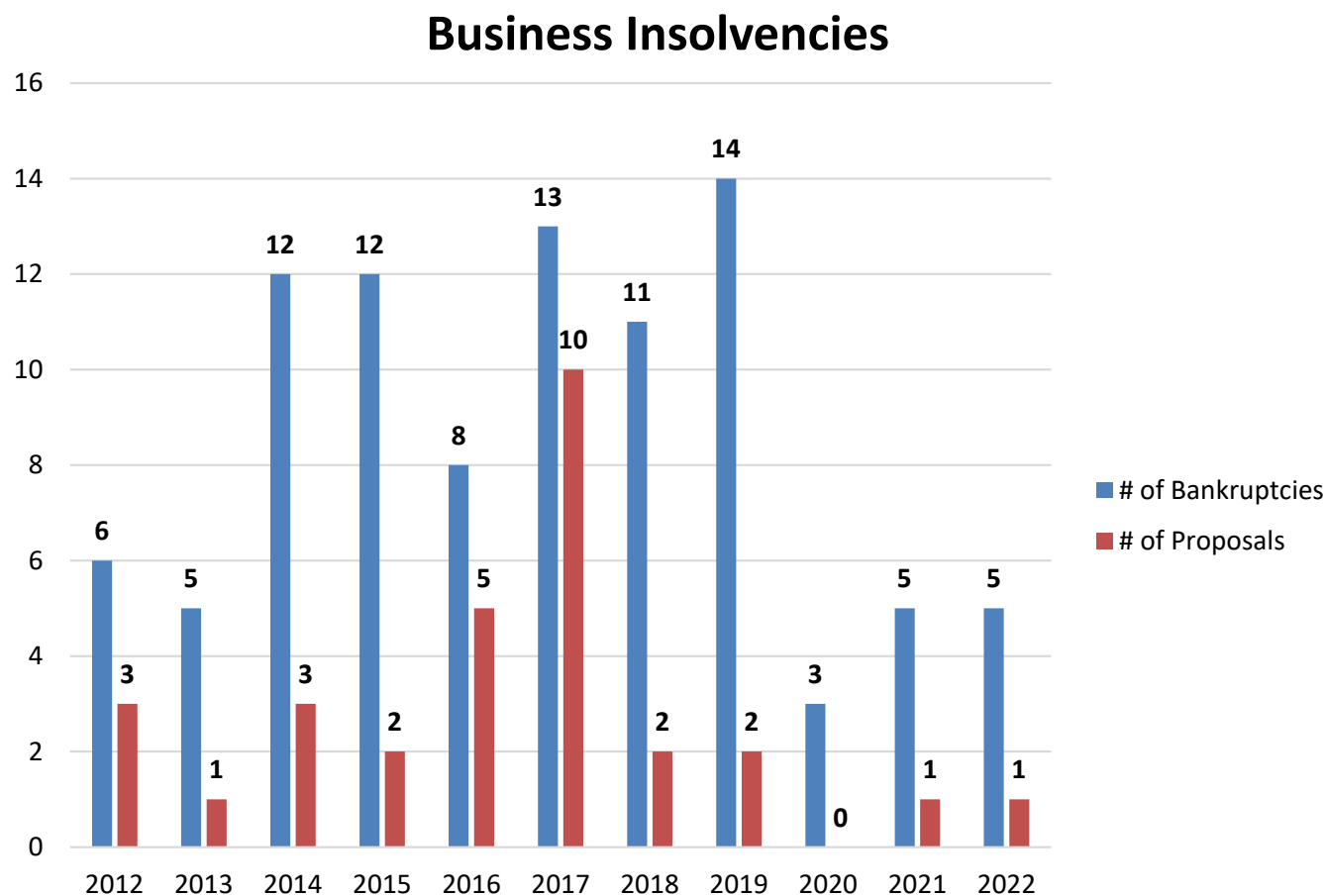

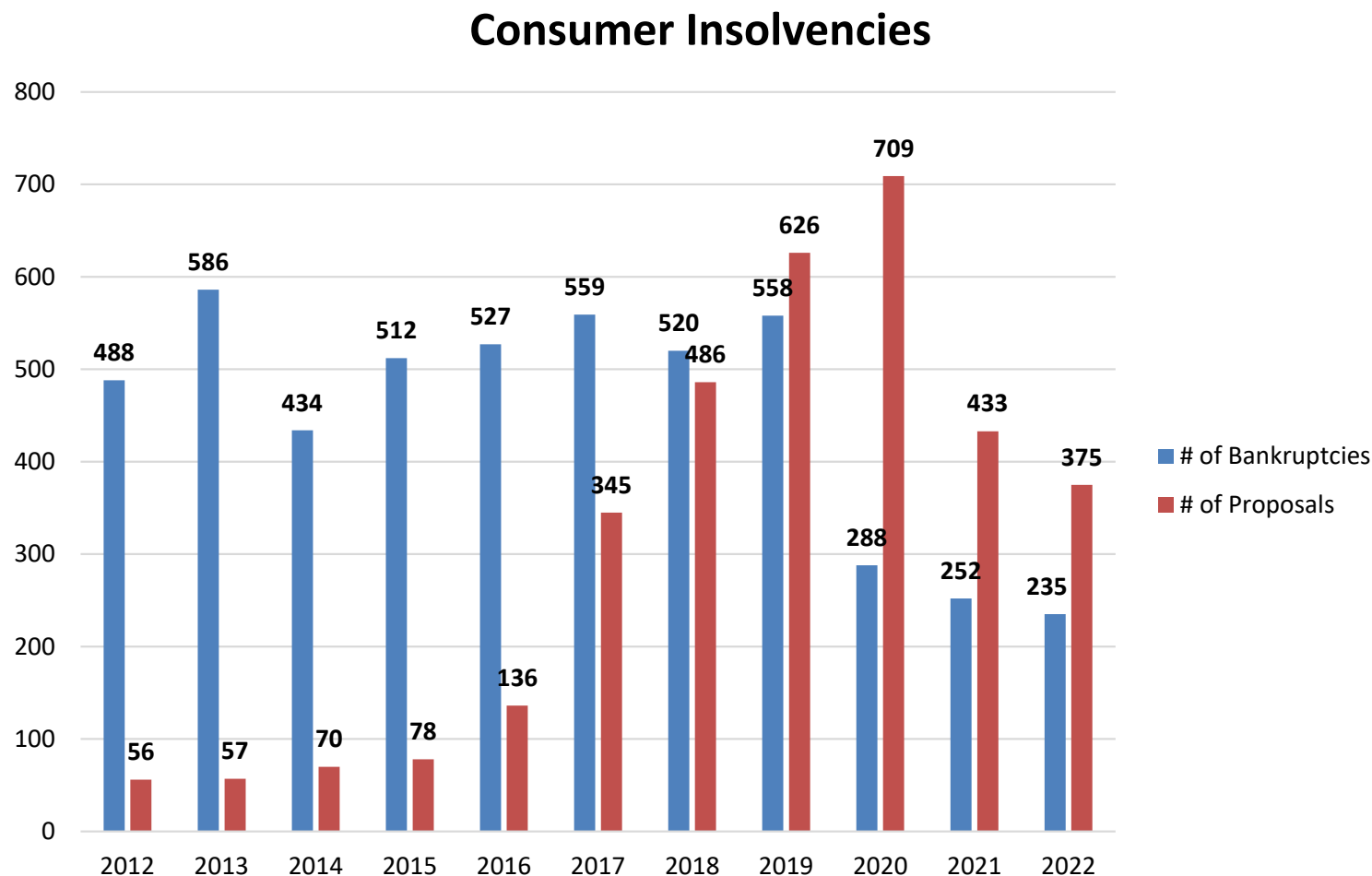

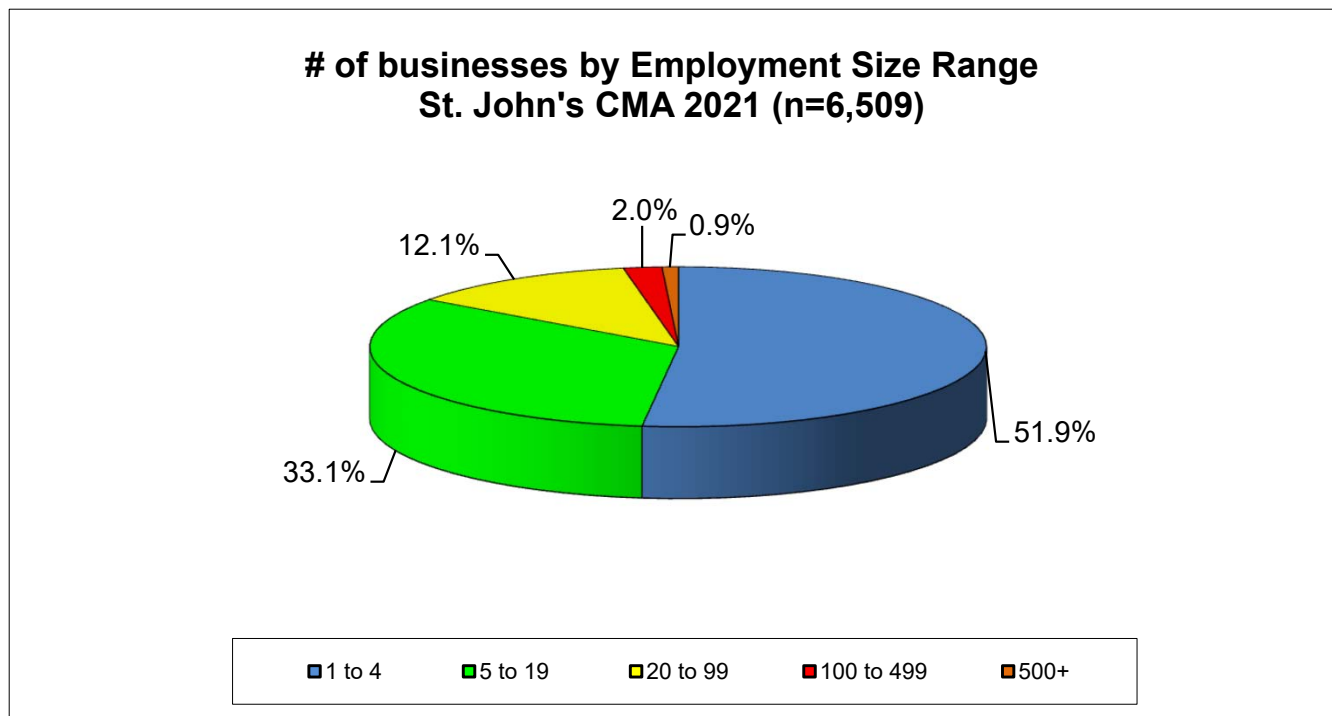

85% of businesses in St. John's CMA have fewer than 20 employees.

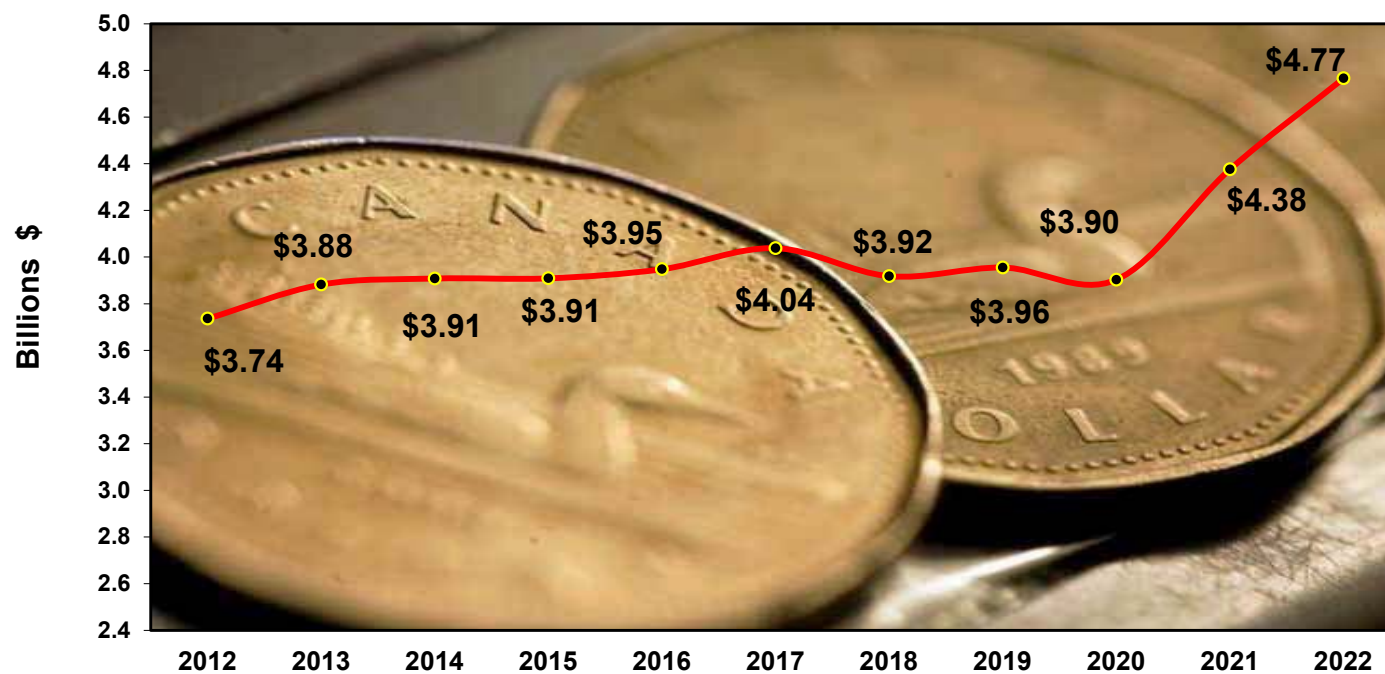

Retail trade increased 7.8% to \$4.8 billion in 2022 mainly due to higher prices.

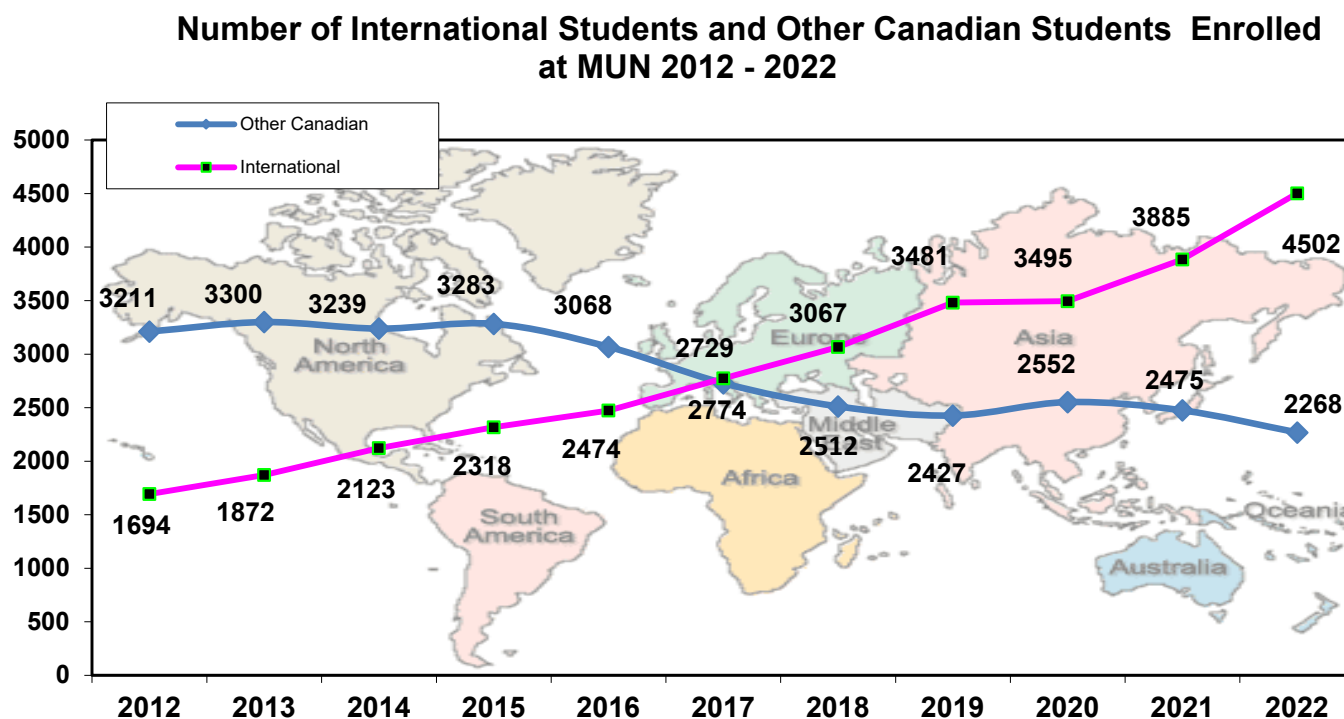
Retail Sales (\$B) - St. John's CMA

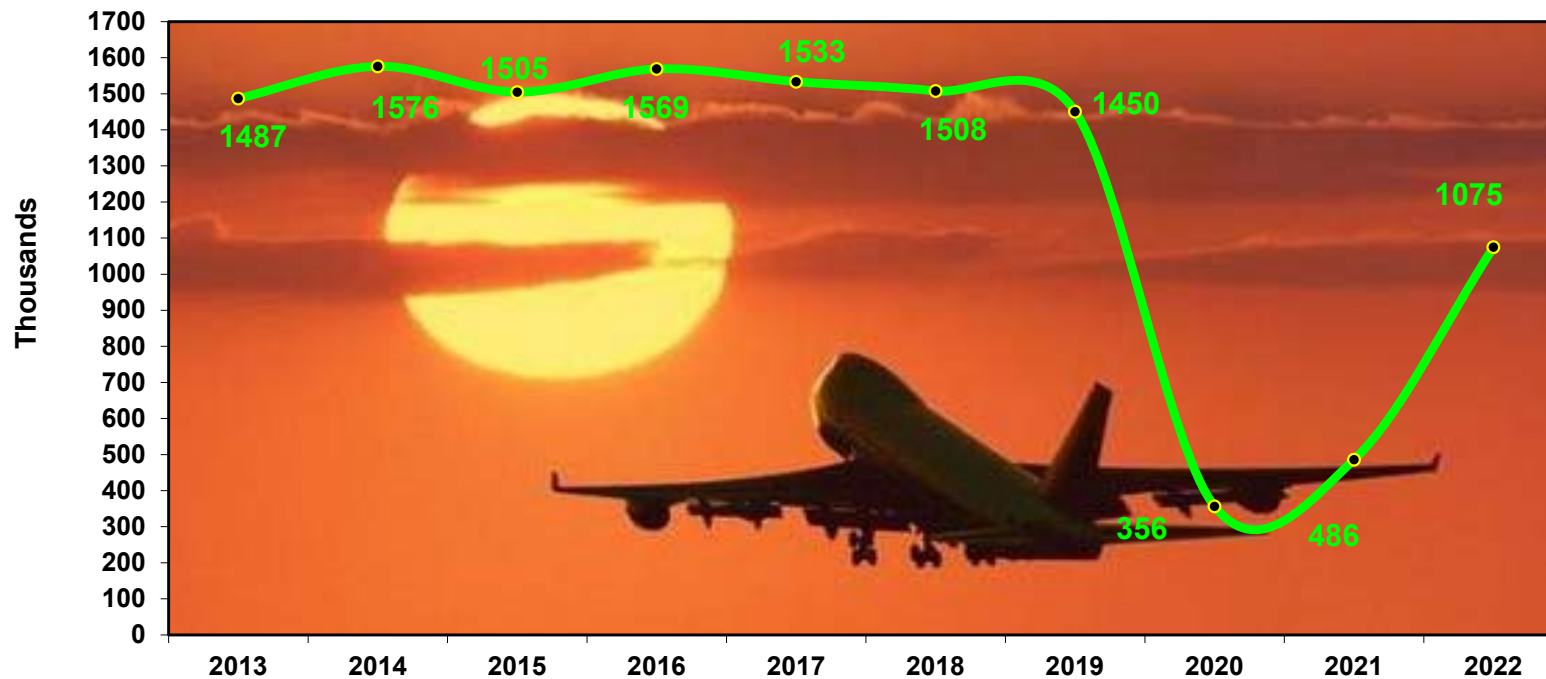

St. John's International Airport 2013 - 2022 (000's)



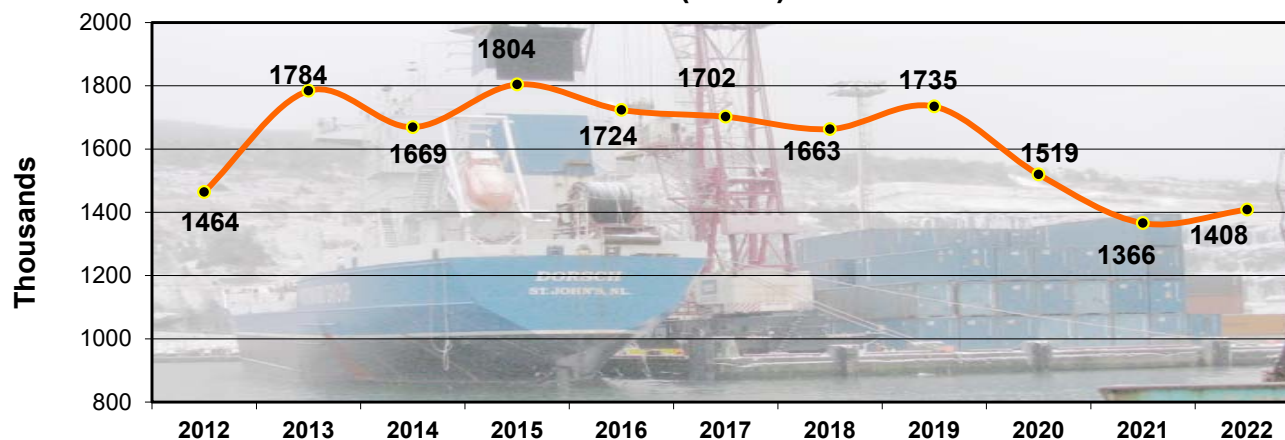

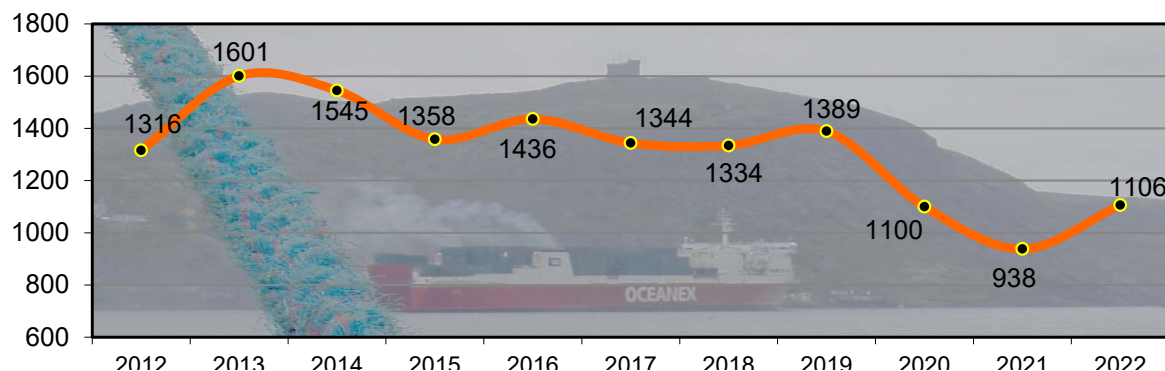
Port Data
