The Housing Catalyst Fund

The Housing Catalyst Fund is a partnership between the Community Housing Transformation Centre (the Centre) and the City of St. John's. The Housing Catalyst Fund supports practical and collaborative projects which lead to transformative change in the sector. The role of this fund is to work with community groups and other stakeholders (housing providers, service providers, non-profit organizations, builders/developers) to facilitate and plan housing solutions that will enhance the quality for life for individuals and families and build a healthier community.

To be considered, projects must be solution focused and action oriented and fill a clearly identified need in the housing sector. Catalyst projects are intended to be concluded in one year or less. Emphasis will be placed on projects that are led by or include a community agency. Applicants must provide an incorporation number. Applicants can apply for up to a \$30,000¹ grant per project.

<u>Partnership between the City of St. John's and the Community Housing</u> Transformation Centre

In September 2020, the City of St. John's and the Community Housing Transformation Centre signed an agreement that triples the funds available for the Housing Catalyst Fund from \$50,000 to \$150,000. Under this new partnership, all grants that are cofunded by the City and the Centre will be disbursed by the Centre and the Centre will hold agreements with the successful recipients. In cases where the City is the sole contributor (i.e. the Centre is unable to fund a project due to their restrictions), the City will disburse the funds and hold agreements with the successful recipients.

The Affordable Housing Strategy and the Centre's Priority Areas

The City of St. John's 10-Year Affordable Housing Strategy 2019-2028 was built from a strong foundation of public engagement and research on the local housing situation and emerging trends in St. John's. The City has identified six strategic components related to affordable housing that will be addressed in the strategy:

- Unlocking Resources
- Building Homes
- Leading Innovation
- Revitalizing Policy
- Cultivating Partnership
- Informing Action
