In addition to being an access point, **811** is also an e-mental health tool, confidential and free, and staffed by experienced Registered Nurses. It is available to all residents of Newfoundland and Labrador any time, day or night.

Emergency Hotlines/Supports

A list of hotlines and supports people can access in St. John's area as well as the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Childcare

All Child-care related supports and programming, such as registered childcare centres, etc.

Community Activities

Recreational programs involving the arts, athletics, and general social events.

Education

Educational programs and support including childcare facilities, tutoring, libraries, etc.

Employment Supports

All types of employment support and skills development programming.

Health

All health-related supports and programming, including mental health, addictions, food security via nutrition and poverty initiatives, advocacy, and support groups.

Housing

Shelters, housing options, and other related supports.

Indigenous

Supports within the Indigenous Communities providing information and resources etc.

Justice

All justice-related supports and programming including crime prevention and reduction, legal aid, victim supports, courts, advocacy, etc.



■ Newfoundland and Labrador Crime Stoppers

Contact **Crime Stoppers** to anonymously report suspicious or covert activity, or to provide a tip or information about an unsolved case or fugitive criminal(s).

Crime Stoppers takes tips about crimes that have already been committed as well as information regarding the whereabouts of wanted people, stolen property, narcotics, or any other criminal activity.

■ Domestic Violence Help Line

Callers can speak with **Domestic Violence Help Line** trained professionals who will assist them directly or connect them to the appropriate service or organization in the community.

■ Intimate Partner Violence Unit (IPVU)

The Royal Newfoundland Constabulary's **Intimate Partner Violence Unit** (IPVU) is a team of dedicated officers trained to assist and support victims of intimate partner violence, by advising of available resources, criminal investigation information, and court process support. The IPVU can help with safety planning, Emergency Protection Orders, and Peace Bond applications.

■ Sexual Violence Support and Information Line

Callers can access non-judgmental, empathetic support and information related to sexual violence through a 24-hour crisis line operated by **End Sexual Violence NL**.

■ Victim Services

Victim Services is a free service offered by the Department of Justice and Public Safety to victims of crime in Newfoundland and Labrador. Victim Services provides assistance to victims of:

- intimate partner violence (domestic violence)
- sexual assault
- criminal harassment (stalking)
- personal violence like assault; assault with a weapon; assault causing bodily harm
- threats
- homicide (family members can access services)
- impaired driving
- property crimes
- theft and fraud

Services are available to adult victims of crime 16 years of age and older whether or not the crime has been reported, or a charge has been laid.

Services are also available to children, youth, or witnesses (under 16 years of age) when charges are laid. A caregiver or legal guardian must consent to services.
