# Silly EGGHEAD Planters

Start your own Egg-Head garden this spring! You can even reuse your painted Easter Eggs.

## **Supplies:**

Eggshells (With just the tops cut off) Dryer Lint (or Soil) Markers for drawing Seeds Water









#### Instructions:

- 1. Have an adult break off the top part of the egg.
- 2. Carefully rinse out the shell and let the shell dry for a couple of days.
- 3. Place your Egghead into an empty egg carton to stabilize.
- 4. Draw silly faces on the eggs with the permanent markers.
- 5. Go to the dryer and grab some dryer lint, place at the bottom of the egg. You can also use soil if you have some on hand.
- 6. Add seeds of your choosing. Maybe try some grass seed, chia seeds, clover or cress seeds. Wet the dryer lint until good and moist.
- 7. Add a little more lint over the top of the seed and wet.
- 8. Make sure to keep the plant moist but do not over-water. You can use an eye dropper to water the plant daily. Two eye droppers full is plenty of water.
- 9. Place your eggs in a sunny spot. After a few days some of the seeds will start sprouting. After about 5 days they will have a nice full head of hair! Ready to style!

Scissors
Chalk
Water

#### Instructions:

- 1. Cut our pieces of tape and place on Egg to create a design.
- 2. Dip your chalk in water and color your designed egg.
- 3. Remove the tape once the eggs are completely dried.
- 4. Hang up and admire!
