

Recreation Counsellor

Role

Recreation Counsellors must be energetic and enjoy working with children, youth and/or seniors in a leadership role. Duties include: implementing a variety of recreational activities as outlined by supervisors; enhancing program content through building on participant interests and directly supervising program participants. Recreation Counsellors must possess a strong sense of safety awareness, good oral communication, customer service skills and problem solving ability.

Qualifications

- Royal Newfoundland Constabulary (RNC) Certificate of Conduct – Dated 2021
- Royal Newfoundland Constabulary (RNC) Vulnerable Sector Check – Dated 2021
- Post - secondary education would be considered an asset.
- Leadership experience/training (i.e. completion of City of St. John's Youth Leadership Programs or equivalent) would be an asset.
- Experience in planning and implementing programming in a group setting and the ability to instruct various sports, outdoor activities, arts/crafts and low organized games.
- Must be comfortable in an aquatic setting as some positions involve activities such as swimming and canoeing/kayaking.
- Candidates possessing an equivalent combination of education and experience that is deemed acceptable by the City may be considered.
